SMU Summer Youth Program 2017 Internships

POSITION OVERVIEW

SMU Continuing and Professional Education (CAPE) will offer multiple internship positions for its Summer Youth Program at SMU-in-Plano during the summer months. Interns will work closely with program staff and classroom instructors to facilitate workshops for students in first grade through high school. Through this internship, participants will gain hands-on teaching experience and will build instructional skills using a variety of techniques to facilitate activities and projects.

Interns will report to the Associate Director and will work directly with Summer Youth staff members and workshop instructors. Interns may apply for full-day (approximately 35 hours per week) or half-day (approximately 25 hours per week) positions, and all interns work Monday through Friday. Summer Youth Internships will run for 8 ½ weeks – from May 31 through August 4 (skipping the week of July 3 - 7). Interns also will have the opportunity for additional on-site training and classroom preparation on the SMU-in-Plano campus (in mid-/late-May).

This position is open to undergraduate or graduate students currently enrolled in an accredited college or university. Priority consideration will be given to students with previous experience working with children. The Summer Youth Program Internship is ideal for those wishing to gain experience with technology and/or art education, classroom teaching, or curriculum development. Interns must be willing to promote the mission of SMU CAPE/Summer Youth Program. Interns must be 18 years old (on or before June 1, 2017) and authorize SMU to obtain consumer reports (credit and/or background checks).

This position will be paid an honorarium of \$12 per hour.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

SMU Summer Youth Program interns will:

- Learn about the day-to-day operations and logistics of a summer camp
- Become familiar with classroom procedures, including daily set-up and clean-up
- Encourage students in projects and activities by modeling skills, providing constructive guidance, fostering collaboration, and problem-solving
- Gain understanding about the needs, abilities, and challenges of various students by working with children of different ages
- Perform other instructional and administrative duties as assigned
