## Payment Plans Pay Off

In a proactive move, SMU expanded the options for payment plans to assist our students and families to pay the charges for spring term. These options have been attractive to our families and has assisted SMU in retaining our undergraduate students.

Undergraduate enrollment is up 1.7% for spring 2009. Families using the 5 month payment plan increased 14%, 10 month payment plan increased 6%, the 4 month payment plan for small balances increased 51%, and the 4 month payment plan for larger balances increased by 31% over spring 2008. Two hundred and thirty-three families are participating in the 9 month payment plan offered for the first time this spring.

May Commencement will mark the first ceremony for the new custom regalia designed specifically for SMU. The undergraduate regalia includes a red stole with blue Dallas Hall logos, the master's regalia adds a red Dallas Hall logo to the gown. President Turner has new custom regalia as well. The distinctive look of the SMU regalia will add color to our ceremonies and stand out as our graduates join the faculty at other institutions.
