ENROLLMENT & STUDENT FINANCIAL INFORMATION

You should NOT attend a class in which you are not officially enrolled! Classes begin on Monday, August 21. If you have not enrolled, you have through Friday, August 25. Payment is due at the time of enrollment. Select link for information on how to pay. <u>smu.edu/bursar/webpay.asp</u>

The last day to ADD courses or DROP courses without tuition billing (*while remaining enrolled for the term*) is Friday, August 25 until 11:59 p.m. The last day to DROP a course without academic record (tuition charges apply) is Friday, September 1. Remember that it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to ensure that your enrollment is accurate and all University deadlines are met.

"NO CREDIT" OR "PASS/FAIL" OPTION

Students may take some undergraduate courses for "No Credit" or "Pass/Fail." "No Credit" Option - Students should indicate in writing no later than the 12^{th} class day that they wish to do so. Permission of the instructor or department is required. "Pass/Fail" Option – 12 hours of pass/fail hours are the maximum total credits that a student can use towards a degree assuming a passing grade in the class. Grades of C- or higher are considered passing. Deadline to complete the Pass/Fail Option Declaration form is the 12^{th} class day. Forms are available in the Office of the Academic Dean. PERSONAL INFORMATION VERIFICATION

If you have not completed this process recently, it is important that you *immediately* log into **my.SMU.edu** to check the accuracy of your information. Click on the Profile tile and then Personal Details. You must verify and update your address, phone number (including cell number if available), emergency contact, and demographic data. Check the box and click "save" after you complete each section. If this information is not verified in a timely manner, a HOLD may be placed on your account for any future enrollment terms at SMU.

EXCUSED ABSENCES

Students who participate in officially sanctioned scheduled extracurricular activities should be given an opportunity to make up class examinations or other graded assignments missed as a result of this activity. Students should be informed by the instructor at the beginning of the term, preferably in writing, of the instructor's makeup policy.
