Current Research:

As Director of Global Theological Education I coordinate a program of inter-cultural immersion courses for Perkins Students. These courses are conducted in seminary and other Christian and non-Christian settings around the world.

- Currently researching how religious identity is constructed in religiously plural settings and issues related to inter-religious relations, as well as in methods of teaching inter-religious dialogue in a theological seminary setting.

- I am part of a larger research project studying indigenous Christian movements in Southeast Asia sponsored by the Center for the Study of Christianity in Asia at Trinity Theological College, Singapore. Specifically I am doing research on the influence of an Islamic environment on the development of indigenous Christianity in Indonesia and Malaysia.
- I am leading a research project studying the relationship of religion and business in Southeast Asia in cooperation with the Social & Behavioral Science Research Cluster of the University of Malaya and its Dean, Terence Gomez.

As Director of the Center of Evangelism and Missional Church Studies I coordinate Perkins research efforts, in association with local church leaders and judicatories, into ways in which congregations can more effectively engage in evangelistic outreach and cross cultural missions.
