Additional DMin Information

- DMin candidates generally have six years from initial enrollment to complete the degree.
- You may defer courses at any point during your program by registering for DM8049 and DM8000 and paying a .5 credit hour fee.
- If you have completed classes but haven't completed your project, you will register for DM8049 and DM8000 and pay a .5 credit hour fee.
- DMin candidates are required to maintain their personal records with SMU Access and to check regularly their SMU email account.
- DMin candidates must register for DM8049 each Fall and Spring. There is no charge for this enrollment.
