Mary Hay/Peyton/Shuttles Commons comprised is of three distinct halls, each with a long history and sense of tradition at SMU. Our approximately 350 residents, Faculty-in-Residence, Residential Community Director, 11 Resident Assistants, and Assistant Residential Community Director make up the largest of SMU's Residential Commons.
