THE COURSE:

STAT 2331, Introduction to Statistical Methods, will be offered at Taos during the August term, 2013. This course covers the basics of statistics for behavioral, biological, and social scientists.

The course is taught by Professor Stephen Robertson, of the Statistical Science Department at SMU. His experience teaching and tutoring many SMU statistics students will help make this class a fun, interactive learning environment in which to take statistics! To broaden each student's learning experience, he will incorporate a variety of real-world applications of statistics within the lectures.

Prerequisites: GEC Math Fundamentals or its equivalent

THE ENVIRONMENT:

The course will be taught at Fort Burgwin near Taos, New Mexico. The SMU facility is an interdisciplinary research and teaching facility located at an elevation of 7,600 feet in a mountain valley of the Sangre de Cristo Range. The campus occupies some 300 acres in the midst of the Carson National Forest, providing opportunities to participate in data collection for a variety of natural resources.
