

Connecting from Off-Campus (Macintosh OS 8.1 and Above)

PPP dial-up connections are provided by Information Technology Services (ITS) as a service to the SMU community. The following information will guide you through configuring PPP, so that you may gain access to many online resources using your computer and a modem. This document assumes that your computer meets the minimum requirements and that your modem is installed and in working condition.

Minimum MAC Requirements:

A Power Macintosh, OS 8.1 or above, V.90 Compatible Modem

Before the Installation:

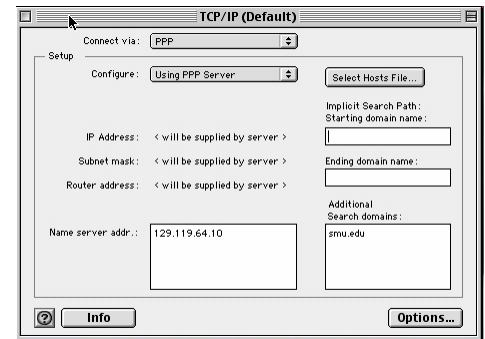
1. You must have your **SMU ID Number** and **Email** password.
2. Connect your modem using a standard telephone cable to a phone jack. If you are not using an internal Apple modem, follow the installation instructions that came with your modem.

Section I. Macintosh OS 8.1 and above

(For OS 10.3.3, please see the reverse)

A. Configure TCP/IP

1. Click the **Apple Menu**
2. Select **Control Panels**
3. Select **TCP/IP**
4. Change settings to match Figure A
 - a. Configure: **Using PPP**
 - b. Domain Name Server: **129.119.64.10**
 - c. Search Domain: **smu.edu**
5. Close the TCP/IP window
6. Click **Save** when prompted

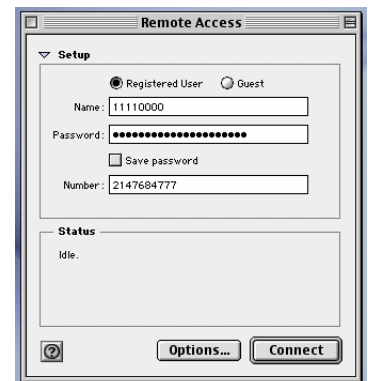

B. Configure Remote Access/PPP

(Note: Mac OS 8.1 users will select PPP. OS 8.5 and above will select Remote Access)

1. Click the **Apple Menu**
2. Select **Control Panels**
3. Select **Remote Access** or **PPP** (Figure B)
4. In the **Name** box, type your **SMU ID number** (i.e. 11110000)
5. In the **Password:** box, type your **Email** password.
6. In the **Number:** box, type **2147684777**
7. Click **Connect**

C. Disconnecting

1. Return to the PPP connection window
2. Click **Disconnect**
3. Close the PPP window by clicking the small box in the top left corner.
4. Click **OK** when prompted to save.

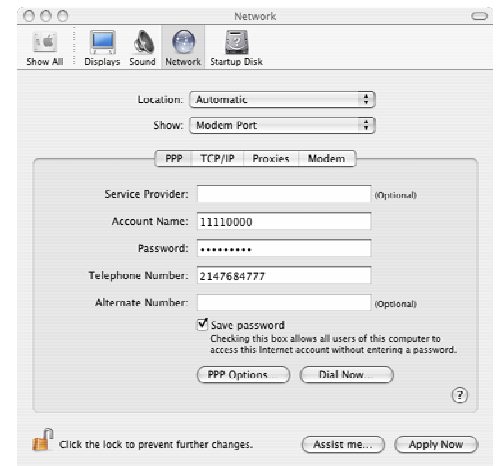

Section II. Macintosh OS 10.3.3

A. Configure the Network Options

1. Click the **Apple Menu**
2. Select **System Preferences**
3. Double-click the **Network** icon
4. Select the **PPP** tab (Figure A)
 - a. In the **Account Name** box, type your **SMU ID number (i.e.11110000)**
 - b. In the **Password:** box, type your password
 - c. In the **Telephone Number:** box, type **2147684710**
5. Select the **TCP/IP** tab. Enter the following information (Figure B)
 - a. Configure IPv4: **Using PPP**
 - b. DNS Servers: **129.119.64.10**
 - c. Search Domain: **smu.edu**
6. Click the **Proxies** tab.
 - a. Verify that all boxes are **NOT** checked. (Figure C)
7. Click the **Modem** tab.
 - a. De-select the “enable error correction and compression in modem” box.

B. Connecting

1. Double-click the **Macintosh HD** icon

C. Disconnecting

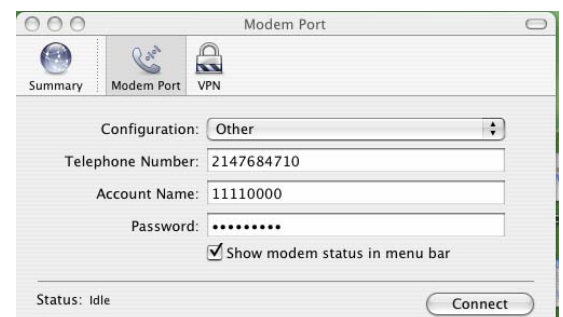
1. Return to the **Internet Connect** window
