At the corner of Binkley Avenue and Bishop Boulevard you can see **Owen Arts Center** to the west, home of **Meadows School of the Arts**. Looking east you will see **Perkins Natatorium** and the outdoor **A.R. "Red" Barr Pool**.

Perkins School of Theology is on the southwest end of **Bishop Boulevard**, across from the south residence halls. **Perkins Chapel** is a significant campus landmark. Be sure to visit **Bridwell Library's** galleries, as well as the nearby **Habito Labyrinth** between Sealeman and Prothro halls.

Meadows Museum houses one of the world's finest and most comprehensive collections of Spanish art outside Spain. Visit the vantage point on the **Sculpture Plaza** featuring *Sho* by Jaume Plensa and overlooking *Wave* by Santiago Calatrava.

Iconic **Dallas Hall**, SMU's first building, overlooks the historic main quadrangle. It is home to **Dedman College of Humanities and Sciences**, the heart of the University.

On the east side of the main quad is the **Laura Bush Promenade**, leading to **Fondren Library Center**. Just beyond is the **Annette Caldwell Simmons School of Education and Human Development**, which is dedicated to finding research-based solutions in fields ranging from reading to applied physiology.

Northwest of Dallas Hall is the **Dedman School of Law**, which is nationally ranked and draws from the strength of the Dallas legal community.

Looking south down Bishop Boulevard, you can imagine thousands of fans in the tailgating tradition known as **The Boulevard** under the expanse of live oak trees.

SMU's **Cox School of Business** is recognized by *BusinessWeek*, *The Economist*, *Financial Times* and *Forbes* as one of the nation's top business schools. Across Bishop Boulevard are the north residence halls and **Dr. Bob Smith Memorial Health Center**.

Your next stop is the **R. Gerald Turner Centennial Quadrangle**. Here you can see the **Cooper Centennial Fountain**, the **Lyle School of Engineering** complex and the **Crain Family Centennial Promenade**, made from pavers purchased by students, faculty, staff, alumni, parents and friends.

Begin your tour on **SMU Boulevard** at the **Ann Lacy Crain Fountain** in front of the **Laura Lee Blanton Student Services Building**, which houses undergraduate admission and financial aid.

Heritage Hall, on the first floor of **Loyd All-Sports Center**, adjacent to **Ford Stadium**, is a must-see exhibition of the history of **Mustang Athletics**. Doak Walker's Heisman Trophy is on display, as well as memorabilia from famous SMU athletes, including golfer Payne Stewart, football great Kyle Rote and a host of Olympic medalists.

Your final stop is **Mustang Mall**, running from **Doak Walker Plaza** north to **Mustang Plaza**, where you can see five new **Residential Commons** buildings and the new **Dining Commons** (all part of SMU's new Residential Commons housing model), the new **Mustang Parking Center**, **Dedman Center for Lifetime Sports** and the new **Mustang Band Hall**. Walking north you encounter the newly renovated **Moody Coliseum** and new **Miller Event Center**, with the **Crum Basketball Center** and the **George W. Bush Presidential Center** nearby.
