

## Spanish Major Requirements for Heritage Spanish Speakers

Heritage Spanish speakers are Spanish/English bilingual individuals who have grown up in a Spanish-speaking environment in the United States. Heritage Spanish students who matriculate in Fall 2013 or thereafter must accumulate a total of 30 term hours of advanced courses to complete the Spanish major. These ten courses must include the following:

<sup>1</sup>It is strongly discouraged that students take courses of different levels concurrently. All 3000-level courses must be taken before registering for any 5000-level course; exceptions will be made for Study Abroad courses. At home, the only exceptions allowed are 4395 that can be taken with 5000 Linguistics courses and 4357 that can be taken with 5000 Literature courses. 4385 can also be taken simultaneously with or after completion of 5000 level courses. Individual courses may have prerequisites.

<sup>2</sup> The electives must be from the same level as highest level course the student is taking. The student cannot take electives from a level lower than the level in which he is enrolled. E.g. if the student is taking 5000-level courses, the elective can only be another 5000-level course, and not a 3000 or 4000-level course.
