The Department of Engineering Management, Information, and Systems (EMIS) invites nominations and applications for an opportunity to be involved in the shaping of an innovative program in Operations Research. Applicants with research interests in large-scale optimization, supply-chain management, high-performance computing, and advanced data analytics are of primary interest. While an appointment at the rank of tenure-track Assistant Professor is anticipated, extraordinary candidates at all levels will be considered.

Eligible candidates must have: completed requirements for a doctoral or other terminal degree in operations research, industrial engineering, or related field by August, 2014; the expertise to teach courses in operations research and advanced analytics at the undergraduate, masters, and doctoral levels; and the ability to develop a strong, externally-funded research program and help advance the frontiers of knowledge. Preferred candidates have a completed Ph.D., experience teaching graduate or undergraduate courses in operations research, and research scholarship that has led to refereed-journal publications and external funding.

The EMIS department resides within the Bobby B.
