Requests for room changes cannot be handled at check-in and must wait until Monday. Such requests must be made in writing through the COSS office. There may be a fee for room changes.

Students residing in the residence halls will be eating on campus and have their meal plans included. The SMU meal plan ensures that students will have available to them regular meals at University dining halls during their stay as well as an average \$10 per week *flex cash* for use at the Hughes-Trigg Student Center for snacks and fast food options, not for personal non-food items. Unused credits are nonrefundable.

Students with a meal plan are provided a Val-e-Dine card upon check-in. There is a \$10 charge for lost cards. Meals are served for the Course of Study beginning Monday. Breakfast will be served from 7:00–8:00 a.m. Lunch is served from 12:30–1:30 p.m., and dinner is served from 5:00–7:00 p.m. Meal service ends with dinner on the Thursday of the last night of your stay.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Students who must cancel their registration must do so by written notification. In order to receive a refund, written notification must be received in the Course of Study School office on or before June 13, 2014. Confirmation of receipt of student's cancellation is also required in order to receive a refund. A \$50 administrative charge will be deducted from a refund of paid fees. Refunds are not available for cancellations made after June 13, 2014, and may take six to eight weeks to process.

PRE-CLASS WORK AND ASSIGNMENTS

Each course requires significant reading and writing prior to the start of classes. These preclass assignments can be downloaded from the Course of Study School section of the Perkins website http://www.smu.edu/Perkins/PublicPrograms/COSS/English/Preclass or received from the Course of Study School office by calling 214.768.2362. Late work for courses 211-514 will be accepted only until June 13; however, grading penalties will be assessed for late papers (see Late Pre-class Work and Penalties). Students submitting work postmarked after June 13 will not be allowed into class.

Pre-class work for courses 111-114 must be submitted to the respective instructors at the first class meeting. Students taking courses 111-114 who are unable to submit pre-class work on the first day of classes should contact the Course of Study School office to cancel course(s) (please review cancellation policy).

Pre-class work for students taking courses 211-514 must be sent to the Course of Study School
