- Provide pastoral support to patients, families and staff within Women & Children's Services
- Facilitate/assist with decedent care protocol
- Develop and facilitate support group for parents who have experienced the loss of a baby
- Provide grief support for siblings
- Offer follow-up grief support by phone
- Facilitate 12 month Infant Loss Bereavement Care Program
- Develop and facilitate Antepartum Support Group with emphasis on emotional and spiritual needs
- Design personalized care/prayer notes for parents with babies in NICU and high-risk mothers on Antepartum
- Collaborate with BUMC Bereavement Care Coordinator to enhance spiritual and emotional support designed specifically to meet the needs of parents who have experienced the loss of a baby
- Celebrate favorable outcomes by inviting family and staff members to participate in a "Parting Blessing" for babies upon discharge
- Offer Baby Bibles to parents and provide Baby Blessings for new infants
- Develop and facilitate Prayer Groups and Sunday Devotionals
- Prepare and facilitate Blessing Ceremonies for staff during Holy Days or Special Occasions such as Nurses' Week
- Facilitate individual and group Critical Incident Stress Management debriefings and diffusings for staff
- Assist with coordinating and facilitating Annual Remembrance Service for families
- Assist with training of MCH Pastoral Care Volunteers
- Assist with high school shadowing program
- Attend interdisciplinary team meetings and function as an integral part of the team
- Develop and facilitate educational programs for patients, families and staff
- Participate in continuing education and professional development opportunities
- Assist with administrative functions related to ministry and decedent care
- Complete monthly and quarterly reports regarding ministry activities
