Doctor of Ministry Summer 2013 Electives

DM 9313 Christian Spirituality

Dr. Heidi Miller, assistant professor of Worship

Tracks: *Spiritual Formation, Preaching and Worship*

June 10-14; 17-20

Time 9:00 - Noon

A study of the biblical roots, historical grounding, theological implications and contemporary context of Christian spirituality and formation in light of God's action in creation. Students will appropriate an integrated and reflective praxis of spirituality for leadership in their context of ministry. Emphasis will be given to the formative possibilities of preaching, worship, pastoral care and mission. Three term hours. **Limit 10 students**

DM 9307 Conflict Transformation

Tracks: *Leadership, Urban Ministry*

This seminar will explore conflict in congregational life, assist the participants in developing their own theoretical and theological understanding of conflict, and offer some practical tools to address conflict. Three term hours. **Limit 10 students**

DM 9305 The Logic of Renewal

Track: *Evangelism*

A critical examination of various proposals for the renewal of the church that have emerged over the last generation and an exploration of their significance for the revitalization of evangelism in the twenty-first century. Three term hours. **Limit 10 students**

DM 9348 Mission and Ministry in a Global Perspective

Tracks: *Missional Church Studies, Urban Ministry, Leadership, Evangelism*

Examines the theological and practical relationships between ministry in contemporary settings and the ways in which increasing globalization is shaping both the ecclesial and social contexts of Christian life. Three term hours. **Limit 10 students**

DM 9370. The Person and the Role of the Minister

An integrative approach to personal and professional issues in ministry. The purpose of this course is to enable the individual to develop a clearer sense of self as this affects the role of minister and to learn an integrative approach to personal and professional issues in ministry. The course will cover three areas: self-understanding, role understanding (office, gifts, and call) and the integration of the two. Three term hours.

DM 8000. Doctor of Ministry Research Course

Use for continuation of the program after required and elective courses have been taken. ½ term hour.

DM 8049. Full Time Graduate Status

DM 9396. Doctor of Ministry Practicum

The Project Practicum is the supervised experience in ministry in an approved setting during which the ministry project proposed in the prospectus is implemented. Three term hours. Work is done off campus (no classes, no syllabi). Required of all D.Min students.

DM 9398. Doctor of Ministry Project (Thesis)

Building upon the Project Practicum the written Project Thesis is a contribution to the understanding and practice of ministry through the completion of doctoral-level project/ thesis. Required of all D.Min students. Three term hours. Writing phase of thesis; self-paced off-campus. (no classes-no syllabi)
