"Going Solo: How The Biggest Demographic Change Since The Baby Boom Is Changing The Way We Live"


Eric Klinenberg, Ph.D., will explore:

- current social-science research on living alone,

Klinenberg is Professor of Sociology and the Director of the Institute for Public Knowledge at NYU. He is the author of three acclaimed books: *Going Solo*; *Heat Wave: A Social Autopsy of Disaster in Chicago*; *Fighting for Air: The Battle to Control America's Media*.

Going Solo, his book about the rise of living alone, is one of the top ideas of the year. In addition to his books and scholarly articles, he has contributed to numerous national publications and radio.

His broad, sweeping ideas straddle multiple disciplines, tracing how different elements of society interact to create the human experience and why, for the first time in human history, people are choosing to live alone.
