This three day workshop prepares participants for implementing the MTS Reading and Spelling Program. Based on Margaret Taylor Smith's Multisensory Teaching Approach (MTA) for Reading and Spelling, MTS for Reading and Spelling encompasses the structure of the English language, including sound-symbol relationships, affixes, syllable types, and syllable division.

MTS is a research-based, upgraded program suitable for:

- *Prevention of reading failure for K-3 students*
- *Supplemental instruction with basal or literature-based reading programs in regular elementary classrooms*
- *One-to-one and small group tutorials for all ages*
- *Special education, all levels*
- *Title I reading classes*
- *Adult literacy programs*
