- Recognize the broad knowledge gained as a foundation for critical thinking, problem-solving and cultural perspectives, all of which employers value.

- Explore diverse career paths beyond the traditional connection between majors and professions.
- Focus on developing skills and excelling in your chosen major various career opportunities exist for different areas of academic focus.

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
