- Whether battling a cold or something on their minds, students can count on excellent care from professionals at our Dr. Bob Smith Health Center.



- Also houses the Loyd All-Sports Center and the Altshuler Learning Enhancement Center, which offers academic success skills and tutoring services for undergraduates.
