BEREA, OH-Akron resident Judy Krutky, Ph.D., professor of political science and international studies, is the recipient of the Student Senate Faculty Excellence Award from Baldwin Wallace University.

Presented May 1 at the University's Ovation honors award ceremony, the award recognizes outstanding classroom instruction, commitment to the academic and leadership development of students, and dedication to the campus community.

The past recipient of BW's Strosacker, Bechberger and Exemplary Teacher awards, Krutky has accrued a long and impressive list of scholarly successes. Her students and colleagues praise her for her passionate and ongoing commitment to student achievement both in and out of the classroom.

She is a champion of intercultural education and was instrumental in starting BW's Language Across the Curriculum program. She has been with BW since 1978.

She earned a B.A. from Southern Methodist University, M.A. from The Johns Hopkins University, and M.A. and Ph.D. from Columbia University. In addition, she was a Fulbright Fellow at the University of Dijon in France.
