Cattle Keepers of Sub-Saharan Africa

Professor Fred Wendorf dedicated his later research to the study of early cattle pastoralism in what is now the eastern Sahara. This presentation summarizes what we know of pastoralism as it spread south into eastern and southern Africa, noting some mysterious delays in the diffusion of cattle and the economies based upon them, as well as the pathways of their spread. It will also outline recent research to shed light on the nature of early pastoralism, including applications of novel methods, to these topics.
