### **Internship Opportunities for Undergraduate and Graduate interns**

Students looking for an internship placement in a nonprofit setting may select from any of the following or a combination of them to do their required internship.

### Counseling and Advocacy (following 30 + hours of training or equivalent):

- Individual and group counseling (graduate students only)
- Screening and Intake for new clients (graduate students only)
- Advocacy: Via phone or Face to face crisis intervention with clients and their friends and family (24-hour hotline and accompaniment\*)
  - \* Students may provide crisis intervention, information and referrals to sexual assault victims at the hospital, the courthouse, or the Police station while on-call

Students will be asked to take two shifts per month one of those shifts will be a hospital and the other will be a hot line/phone shift.

Graduate Students are required to make a minimum of two-semester commitment

# Crisis Hotline/Hospital Advocacy/Administration

Help reduce the trauma a survivor experiences from an attempted or completed sexual assault. This is made possible through:



- Advocacy: Via phone (our crisis hotline) or Face to face (hospital accompaniment) crisis intervention with clients and their friends and family.
- Providing emotional support and information to survivors, and survivor's family members and friends.
- Providing information to help a survivor understand sexual assault impact, police procedures, the sexual assault examination, legal process, counseling opportunities, and other needed resources.
- Students will have the opportunity to learn various aspects of program administration from research and data development to program design as required by their program. This can include:
  - Grant research
  - Fundraising
  - Special event planning/execution
  - General office needs
- Student must be available during regular office hours, Monday-Friday from 9-5 pm.

- 1. Complete an application
- 2. Complete an interview and screening process
- 2. Pass the criminal background check
- 3. Complete DARCC Advocate training
- 4. The Victim Advocate Training Final Exam will be given at the end of training. Those scoring lower than 70% will be required to have further training and re-take the test.
