- 2. The agenda was approved.
- 3. The minutes of the Faculty Senate meeting on October 2, 2019 were approved.
- 4. The minutes of the Special Faculty Senate meeting on October 23, 2019 were approved.
- 5. The Faculty Senate went into executive session to discuss and vote on the recommendations of the Honorary Degrees Committee.
- 6. Vice President Christine (Chris) Regis, University's chief business and financial officer presented information about the financial sustainability of the University and overall budget:
  - a. Overall SMU operating budget
    - i. Revenue: 71% of the revenue is tuition from undergraduate and graduate students; much of the remainder is from Endowment support, Gifts, and in the future if all goes well, SMUGO.
    - ii. Expenses: Salary and benefits, debt service, athletics
    - iii. Overall projection
    - iv. Cash Flow
    - v. Rating: Moody, Fitch, S&P
  - b. The budget model and model assumptions
  - c. Capital campaign
  - d. Endowments
  - e. Summary of Financial Status

- i. Under current assumptions, we have sufficient net revenue to support operations thru 2023
- ii. Cash balances remain adequate to fund operations, grant activity and capital projects
- iii. Rating agency metrics support SMU maintaining current ratings
- f. Areas of Cost sensitivity:
  - i. Future tuition
  - ii. Success of SMUGO
  - iii. Endowment growth will be necessary
  - iv. Funding for financial aid
  - v. Compensation Expense growth
  - g. Options to address Serious Financial Stress:
    - i. Increase enrollment
    - ii. Decrease financial aid
    - iii. Reduce compensation cost.
