




Helpful Uses




- Visuals and Key Words Help Analysis & Memory
- Visually Highlight Context
- Supplement Working Memory (e.g. key language)
- Springboard for discussion (e.g. question; provocative image)

Example of Context Slide




Example of Memory Aid

- IF **ALL DEFENDANTS** RESIDE IN THE **STATE** WHERE THE DISTRICT IS LOCATED




Example of Discussion Springboard




Too many words

CHARACTERISTICS OF GOOD TEACHING AIDS:

- They should be meaningful and purposeful.
- They should be accurate in every aspect.
- They should be simple.
- They should be cheap.
- They should be improvised as for as possible.
- They should be large enough to be properly seen by the students for whom they are meant.
- They should be up-to-date.
- They should be easily portable.
- They should be according to the mental level of the students.
- They should motivate the learners
