

Lessons from Cognitive Psychology


- Goal: Information Transfer

Students' motivation determines, directs, and sustains what they do to learn.

Instructor views results




If students are split, have them discuss in pairs and revote

How it Works


Most students answer correctly: briefly discuss and move on
