


OVERVIEW

Corporate attorneys play a vital role in advising and handling various legal matters for businesses. This includes entity selection, compliance, mergers and acquisitions, and corporate governance. Some attorneys may also specialize in litigation related to corporate disputes.

This handout helps you plan your path to a business law career, covering essential competencies for clients and legal employers. As you plan, ensure you incorporate all three sides of this triangle.¹



The base comprises fundamental **Technical Competencies**, including knowledge of the law, legal analysis, legal research, communication in the legal context, and legal judgment.

OWNERSHIP OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMPETENCIES

<u>Cultivate Your Personal Network:</u> Reach out to corporate attorneys to arrange informational interviews through the Mustang Exchange or connections you establish during your law school journey. You should also ask your Career Services advisor to help you identify graduates and law firms in this space in the location(s) where you want to work.

Full-time and adjunct professor who teach business law courses may have strong networks. Ask them for assistance making these connections.

Attend programs featuring business law attorneys sponsored by the Office of Career Services or student organizations. These kinds of programs are great opportunities to learn more about entry-level careers and to connect with speakers who are often alumni and more willing to assist you.
