2nd Notice!! Final Exams – IMPORTANT for anyone with testing accommodations

Final Exams will be held beginning May 6th through May 12th. The University's final exam schedule can always be found on the SMU website.

All exams will be delivered virtually and the procedures for DASS students should likely be the same as every other exam by notifying your instructor well before the exam date to ensure your accommodations can be set in place. (Dedman Law students should contact Dean Yeager's office or Kim Grace).

DASS assumes your instructors will be able to virtually proctor you for final exams, but If there is a conflict that can't be resolved between you and your instructor, our office can offer support.

If your instructor needs DASS to proctor your final exam, you, the student, must schedule no later than April 29th in DASS Link. Be sure to select "Final exam" so the system calculates the extended time correctly. Call before 4/29/21 with any questions. 214-768-1470.
