Cox School of Business Executive Board Meeting This Week

SMU Joins the National Tuition Exchange Consortium

This week, SMU <u>announced</u> that it would be joining <u>Tuition Exchange</u> (TE), a national consortium of colleges and universities that provides educational scholarships to its more than 670 member institutions. Beginning in spring 2023, dependents of SMU benefits-eligible employees will be able to apply for full or partial tuition awards at other TE member institutions. SMU in Four: Year-One Progress Shared

SMU in Four, our Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP), is the University's comprehensive approach to improving SMU's retention and four-year graduation rates. To this end, our QEP advances student academic success through its most essential form: progress toward degree. On September 28, the SMU in Four team shared updates related to early-alert mechanisms, undergraduate academic advising, technology enhancements, plus gateway and introductory courses.
