

# **Simmons Graduation 2024 FAQ**

## Q: Where do I apply to walk in the Simmons Graduation?

A: You must first apply to graduate via My.SMU.edu. Once you have applied to graduate, you will receive an email (to your SMU Email address) to apply for Simmons Graduation ceremony.

### Q: If I am not participating in the ceremony, do I still fill out the RSVP survey?

A: Yes. All graduate candidates of Simmons need to complete the RSVP survey.

#### Q: Where can I get tickets for the ceremony?

A: Simmons graduate candidates will only be able to request tickets through their graduation RSVP link via their SMU email address. If you missed the email, contact your department specialist or academic advisor if you are an undergraduate.

#### Q: How many tickets can a graduate get for guests to the ceremony?

A: All candidates are guaranteed up to 6 tickets. Additional tickets may be requested, and the candidate will be notified 2 weeks prior to the ceremony if extras become available.

#### Q: Do graduates need a ticket for the ceremony?

A: No, the tickets are for guests. All guests will need a ticket to enter the McFarlin Auditorium.

#### Q: Where do I get my graduation regalia?

A: When you apply for Graduation via My.SMU.edu, you will receive that information. This includes the correct hood for graduate and doctoral candidates. Please check to make sure you have the correct color hood and tassel. The SMU bookstore staff can help you.

## Q: Can I wear my honor cords in the Simmons graduation ceremony?

A: Yes. Honor cords may be worn.

### Q: Are honor cords handed out at the ceremony?

A: No. You are responsible for picking up your honor cords from your program director/leader prior to graduation ceremonies.

## Q: I am a doctoral student, where do I pick up my hood?

A: All doctoral students will receive their hood at the ceremony.

# Q: If I or a guest needs wheelchair accessibility, what do I do?

A: There is a separate ADA entrance at McFarlin Auditorium with an elevator available. There are handicap seating options available in the auditorium as well.
