

Dear Prospective Eagle Scholars Intern:

Thank you for your interest in the Vickery Meadow Eagle Scholars Summer Internship.

Vickery Meadow is a densely populated community right across the freeway from Northpark Mall. Many immigrants, refugees, and people of many different ethnicities call Vickery home. The families have vast social and economic needs, but also have children full of potential. Families in the Vickery community are seeking ways their children to advance and seize opportunities that were never available to them.

Eagle Scholars was developed to provide 7th-12th grade students with these opportunities. Students at Tasby middle school are nominated by teachers at the end of their 6th grade year. Older Eagle Scholars help interview and choose the 30 new students who enter the program each year. Once in the Eagle Scholars program, students receive encouragement, assistance, guidance, and opportunities until they graduate from high school.

Eagle Scholars University summer program was developed in response to a need and desire by students to gain a better understanding of college as well as provide them with the knowledge of skills needed to stay on track in order to be prepared to enter college. We utilize an experiential learning approach by creating a simulated college environment that includes required courses, electives, and career tracks.

If you will begin your junior or senior year of college in the fall semester, or if you are a recent college graduate (within 2 years), you are eligible to become an Eagle Scholars University Intern. Please complete the following before March 31. We will begin hiring as we receive applications and will continue accepting applications until all positions are filled.



Teens as Teachers – teens plan and facilitate an educationally-based program for elementary-aged students in the community.

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
