

TERMS TO KNOW:

EARLY DECISION I

SMU is your top choice; complete the application process early – by November 1 – and receive a decision by December. If admitted, you commit to attend and withdraw all other applications.

EARLY ACTION

Complete the application process early – by November 1 – and receive a decision by December. If admitted, you have until May 1 to commit to attend.

EARLY DECISION II

SMU is your top choice; complete the application process by January 15 and receive a decision in February. If admitted, you commit to attend and withdraw all other applications.

REGULAR DECISION

Complete the application process by January 15 and receive a decision in March. If admitted, you have until May 1 to commit to attend.

GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS
