Applicants to the Health & Society Major are required to: have a 2.0 GPA, completed or be in the process of completing 24 credit hours at SMU, **completed** both ANTH 3306 and the Lab Science course requirement with a minimum grade of C-. For true transfer students, they must have completed their first semester at SMU; at minimum, be enrolled in ANTH 3306 at the time of application; and have completed the Lab Science requirement either at SMU or through transfer credit. Applicants will submit the completed Interest Form and all application materials electronically by the deadline. This highly competitive major can only accept a limited number of students. Applications are reviewed after February 15 and before spring advising. Return completed forms to: Dept. of Anthropology, tapowell@smu.edu. Please note that all courses for the major must be completed prior to registering for the Capstone course and the student must have already been accepted to the program in order to enroll in the Capstone. Students may only apply to the program once and should be either a first- or second-year student.
