Golden Mustang Award

The Golden Mustangs is an Alumni group, whose members graduated 50 or more years ago. This group has established the Golden Mustang Endowment for the advancement of teaching and learning. The award provides a \$1000 unrestricted stipend to the recipient.

The Academy of Distinguished Teachers at Southern Methodist University is an organization consisting of eight recipients of the SMU Distinguished Teaching Professors Award. It serves the academic community through the Center of Teaching Excellence by actively fostering superior teaching and learning through colloquia, workshops, lectures and mentoring. Four faculty are selected each spring to serve two years in the Academy, receiving \$10,000 as part of the award. To be eligible, nominees must be full-time, tenured SMU faculty, have been at SMU for at least five years, be in residence for the two-year Academy membership, show demonstrable excellence in teaching, and show demonstrable commitment to student learning.
