Pre-Class Assignments:

Each of the Pre-Class Assignments should be answered in the body of the paper. These two papers together will count for 20% of your grade and will be graded according to: 1) content — well thought out and complete answer, and 2) fulfilling instructions for the assignment including length and deadline.

Both assignments are due on the First Day of Class.

Pre-Class Assignment #1:

Answer the following question after reading the book Soul Feast.

Length of Assignment: 4-6 pages

The paper should reflect your own thoughts and not necessarily what the author says. Rather, it is expected that your answers will be informed by your reading of the book.

Question: What is the significance of Spiritual Maturity from a Christian Perspective? Questions to consider for the paper:

- 1. What is Christian Spirituality?
- 2. What does it take to become Spiritually Mature?
- 3. What hinders us from spirituality?
- 4. What is the role of the Triune God?
- 5. What is the role of the Church?

Please use Biblical References to support your paper.

Pre-Class Assignment #2:

Answer the following question after reading the book Formation in Fatih.

Length of Assignment: 4-6 pages

The paper should reflect your own thoughts and not necessarily what the author says. Rather, it is expected that your answers will be informed by your reading of the book.

Question: What is a Disciple of Jesus Christ and how do we form disciples?

Questions to consider for the paper:

- 1. What is authentic relationship?
- 2. What is a communion of grace?
- 3. What does it take to grow in faith?
- 4. What type of leaders does the Church need to make disciples?
- 5. What is included in an intentional process of faith formation?
- 6. What challenges the Church in making Disciples?
