Removing References to the University Curriculum: As we prepare to sunset the University Curriculum (UC) this summer, we wanted to notify faculty that the UC website and associated materials will be decommissioned. With only 54 students remaining on this curriculum—most of whom are expected to graduate this spring—it is time to begin phasing out references to the UC. We kindly ask that faculty review their syllabi and remove any specific references to UC Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) in preparation for the upcoming academic year. This summer UC requirements will also be removed from my.SMU Advanced Course Search and removed from the Registrar Forms Library. More communications and details will be shared this summer, along with reminders in early fall.

**SMU Graduation Survey**. Each term, the Office of Institutional Planning and Effectiveness (IPE) sends a survey to all graduating students (graduate and undergraduate) to gather information about their future plans (employment, graduate school, military service, etc.). This information is vital to SMU because it supports the calculation of employment outcomes, graduate school acceptance rates, and average salary information that we report publicly and to various agencies. The quality and accuracy of this information directly impacts SMU's reputation and informs decisions by prospective students about whether or not to attend SMU. Data collected is aggregated and reported on the SMU Career Outcomes dashboard. IPE will be launching the survey for May graduates on Friday,

April 25. Please encourage all students graduating at all levels to complete this survey. It takes only about 10 minutes to complete, and it directly impacts the value of our current – and future – students' SMU degree.

Call for Proposals and Registration open: SMU Annual Place-Based Community Engagement (PBCE) Symposium. The deadline for the PBCE Symposium's call for proposals is April 30, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. This will be the 4th annual SMU Place-Based Community Engagement Symposium, a gathering of thought leaders, academics, community leaders, and nonprofit professionals from SMU and the DFW area. Please share this with your department and encourage faculty, especially those who engage in community-engaged research or teaching. This event is designed to explore the transformative potential of community engagement within specific geographic contexts. This year's theme is Thriving Together: A Place-Based Approach to Combating Isolation through Connected Communities. The symposium takes place in early November.
