Guidelines for the Use of Generative AI in Dissertations and Theses: The Moody School of Graduate and Advanced Studies section of the 2025-2026 Graduate Catalog will include guidelines for the use of generative AI in dissertations and theses. These guidelines include resources, advice, and expectations for departments that offer graduate programs which require dissertations and theses; for dissertation and thesis advisors and committee members; and for graduate students working on dissertations and theses. The guidelines were developed by the Moody School Graduate Council, and received input from faculty and student committees including the Faculty Senate Academic Policies Committee (APC), the Academic Affairs Forum, the Faculty Technology Council, and the Moody School Graduate Student Advisory Board. New Queries Available to Monitor Grade Submission Timeliness. Timely grade submission is crucial for students to ensure they receive their final grades promptly for academic standing, degree progress, and financial aid eligibility. It also supports the Registrar's Office in meeting reporting deadlines and maintaining accurate records. University Decision Support (UDS) has created two new queries to help monitor whether grades are submitted on time for specific schools and departments. They are available for use: U_SRX_RPT_GRADES_POSTED and U_SRX_RPT_GRADES_POSTED_DATA. Additional information on using these queries can be found at these links:

These reports are accessible to department chairs and deans and show whether a grade was submitted within the required three-day window following final exams or if it was reported late. Designed to respectively provide insights at both the course level and in aggregate by school, these queries offer a comprehensive view of grade submission trends, helping track and address delays as needed. In keeping with our annual updates to the longitudinal data for faculty position requests, all academic leadership will receive a link to the 2024-25 updates to the 8-year trendlines (e.g., faculty counts, adjunct counts, student counts, student credit hours, and research expenditures) in the week prior to spring break. Please know that this will be sent as a standalone email from the Office of Faculty Success with a link to a password-protected Box folder. Chairs and associate deans use this data each year to support conversations among deans and the Provost each May as they determine priorities for faculty position searches in the upcoming academic year.
