

September 2025 Roundup

Department Chairs, Associate Deans, and Deans,

With a goal of staying connected on internal governance issues, the Provost Office sends a monthly Roundup on the final Friday of each month to the internal university leadership.

Early Participation Reports (Due September 30). Faculty teaching undergraduate courses are expected to complete the Early Participation and MidTerm Progress Reports. Please remind your faculty and offer support to faculty teaching for the first time. The attached letter also provides directions for how you can check on progress by viewing the data from the query tool in my.SMU. Pulling your data when you are ready to send your reminder is most helpful as it captures immediate changes. The most helpful query to monitor faculty specific EPR and MPR submissions is U_SR_GR5950_MTL_PARTIC_COURSE.

2025 Change to University Wide Academic Progress. This is the first semester that SMU will notify new students that they have been placed on Academic Alert at the end of their first semester (see attached SMU2025 Catalog Academic Progress for more details). Academic alert is a warning that the student fell below minimum GPA (2.0) and completed semester credit hour requirements (12). An academic alert does not prevent future enrollment and is not displayed on their academic record. We are drawing your attention to this change because SMU has not previously used completed semester credit hours as a metric by which to evaluate academic good standing. We hope that this shift will encourage students to persist in courses where they are doing well (above a B-) but may not necessarily be able to earn an A. This shift may also result in a few more students asking faculty if they may change to Pass/Fail in the course so that they can keep the credit but not necessarily earn the letter grade. November 25 is the last day to: declare a course pass/fail (see UG catalog for specific information), drop a course (grade of W), or withdraw from the University (grades of W). *(This date does not apply to courses in which the last class meeting and final exam have occurred.)*

Nominations Now Open for Moody Outstanding Mentor Awards. The Moody School of Graduate and Advanced Studies and the Center for Teaching Excellence are now accepting nominations for Moody Outstanding Mentor Awards. These awards recognize exceptional mentoring of graduate students and postdoctoral scholars by SMU faculty. Four awards are given each year. Each department may nominate one faculty member for this award each year. All full-time SMU faculty who work closely with graduate students and/or postdoctoral scholars are eligible for nomination. Moody Outstanding Mentor Awards provide a fund of \$10,000, to be used by the end of the following academic year, to support research and professional development expenses for graduate students and postdoctoral scholars under the awardee's mentorship. In addition, awardees will each receive \$1,000 for their personal use. Nominations should be submitted via the online form [here](#) no later than Friday, Oct. 10.
