Gaining acceptance to medical school involves many complex factors beyond numerical metrics. Statistical information related to medical school acceptances often lacks essential components considered by an admissions committee when assessing competitive applicants. Strong letters of recommendation and extracurricular experiences including, shadowing, community service, research, leadership, and healthcare exposure are vital parts of a student's application. A clear and strong sense of motivation, as conveyed in the personal statement, application, and *interview is also crucial*. Students applying through the *Health Professions Recommendation Committee (HPRC) with competitive metrics, attributes, AND experiences are often better prepared at the time of application and interview. Additionally, medical programs seek applicants whose goals align with their institutional missions, as reflected in secondary applications.
