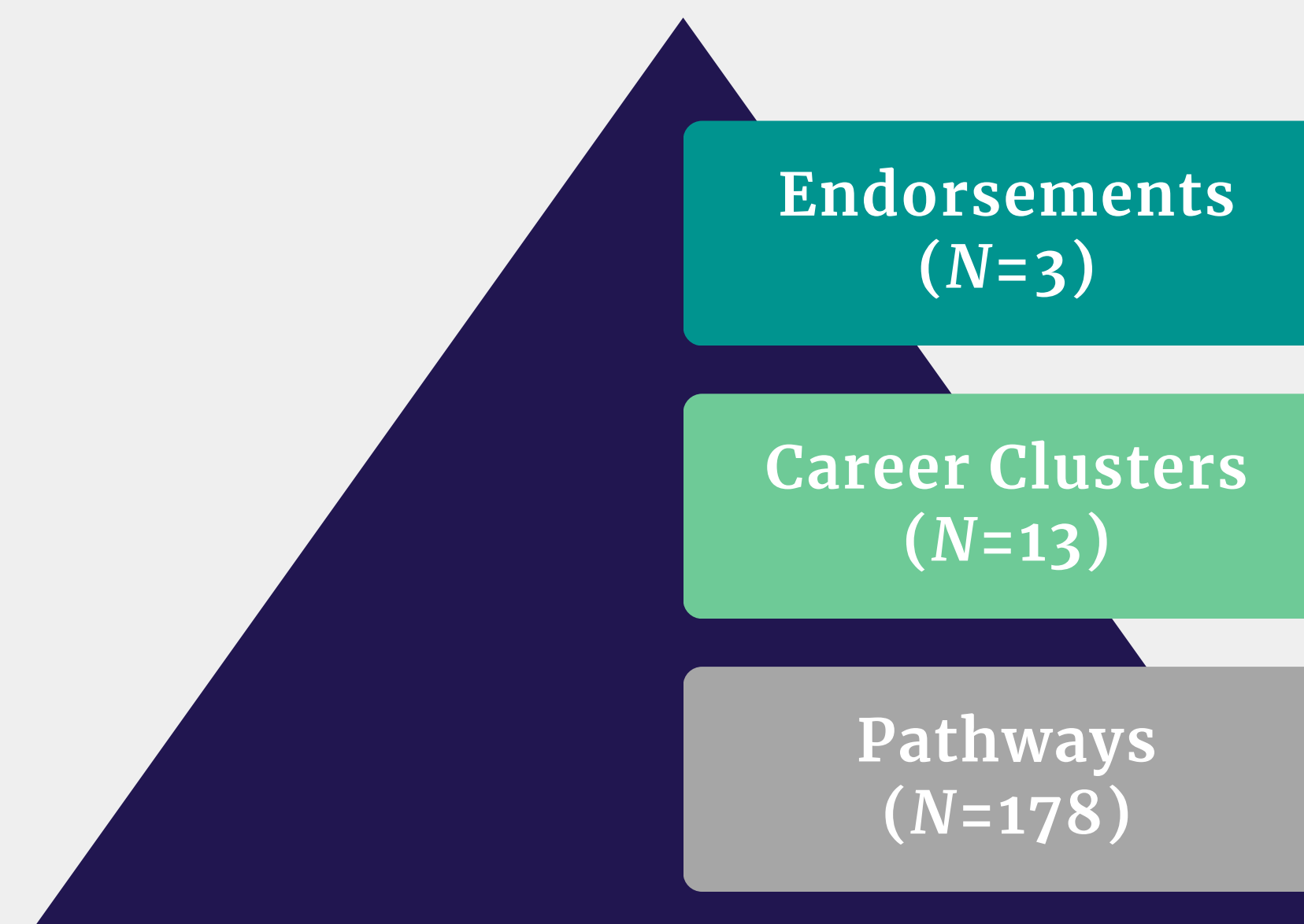

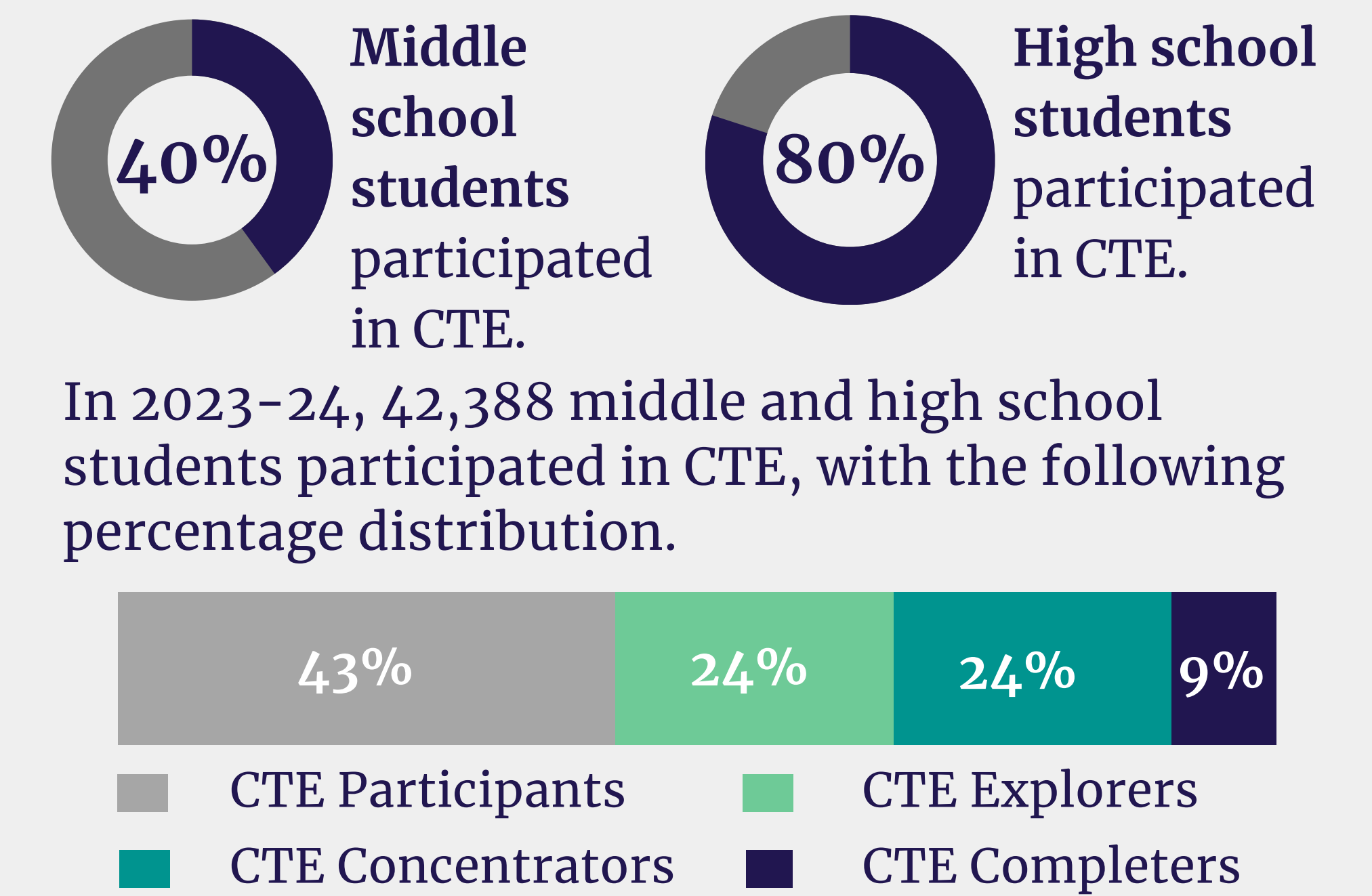
## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

- The purpose of the Dallas ISD CTE program is to prepare students for college and career success by providing them with the skills needed to compete in the global economy.
- In 2024-25, the district offered courses across 178 comprehensive CTE pathways for students in grades six through 12.
- Students can also participate in CTE through National Academy Foundation (NAF), Career Institutes (CI), or Pathway to Technology High Schools (P-TECH) programs.

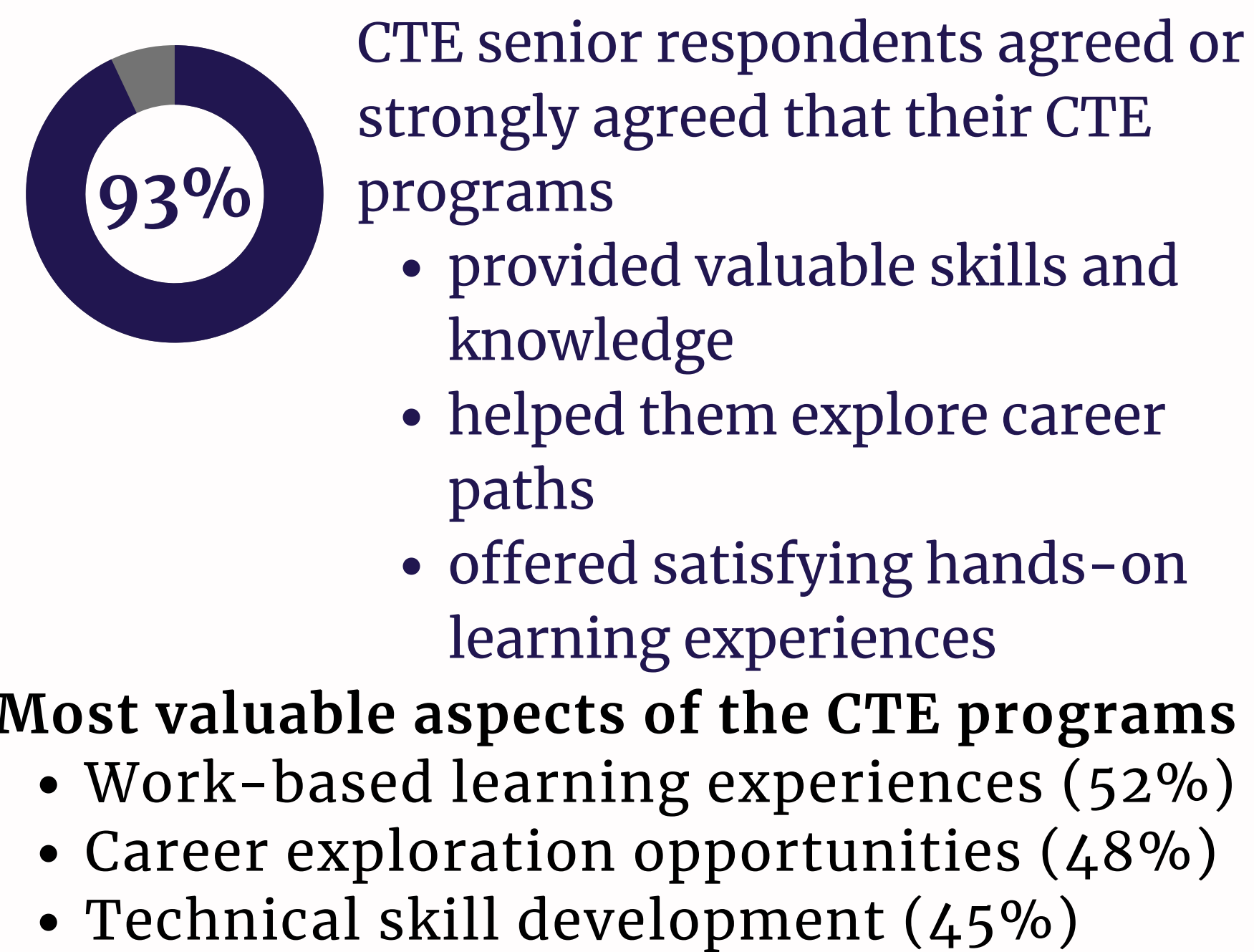

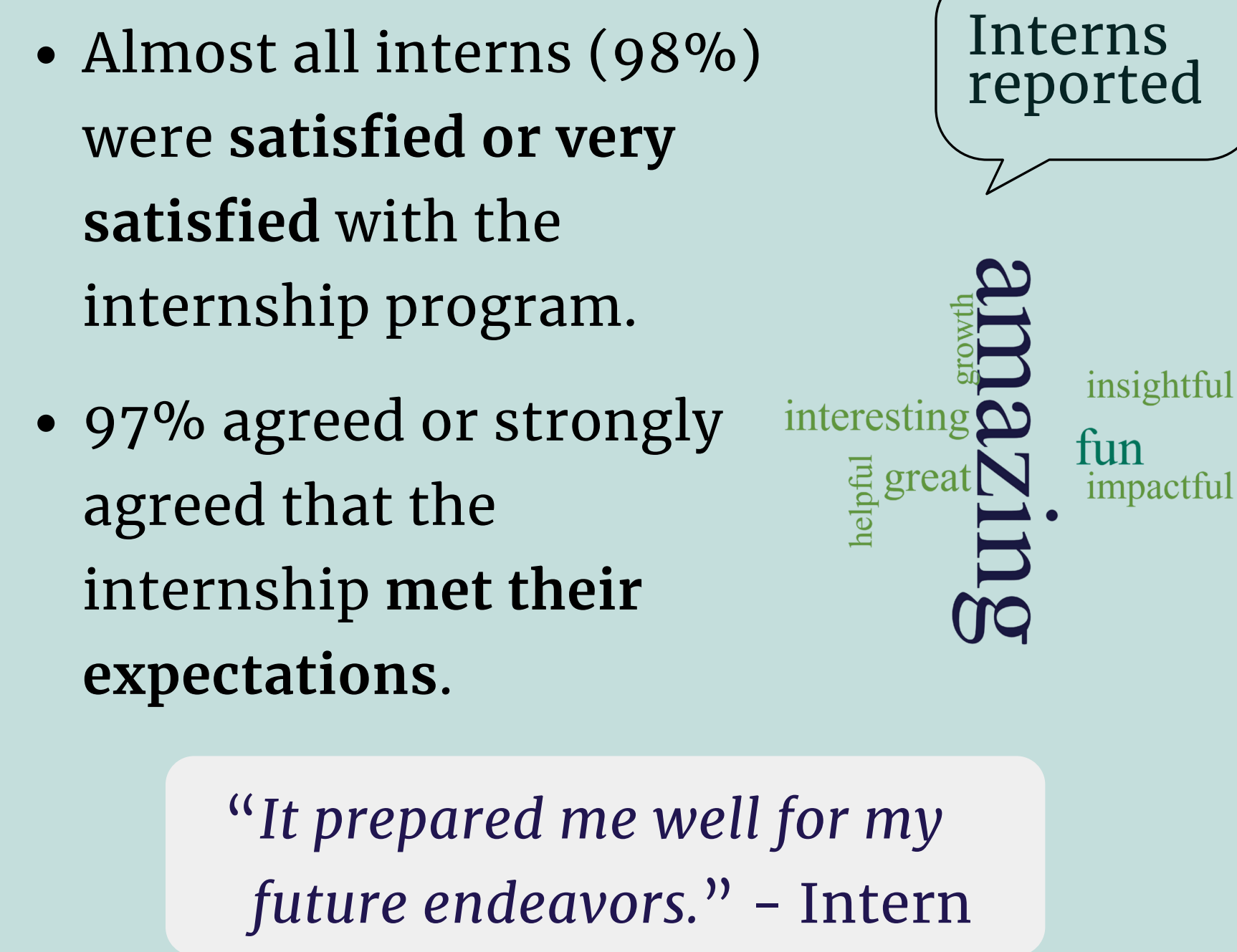
## CTE PARTICIPATION



## CTE SENIOR EXIT SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

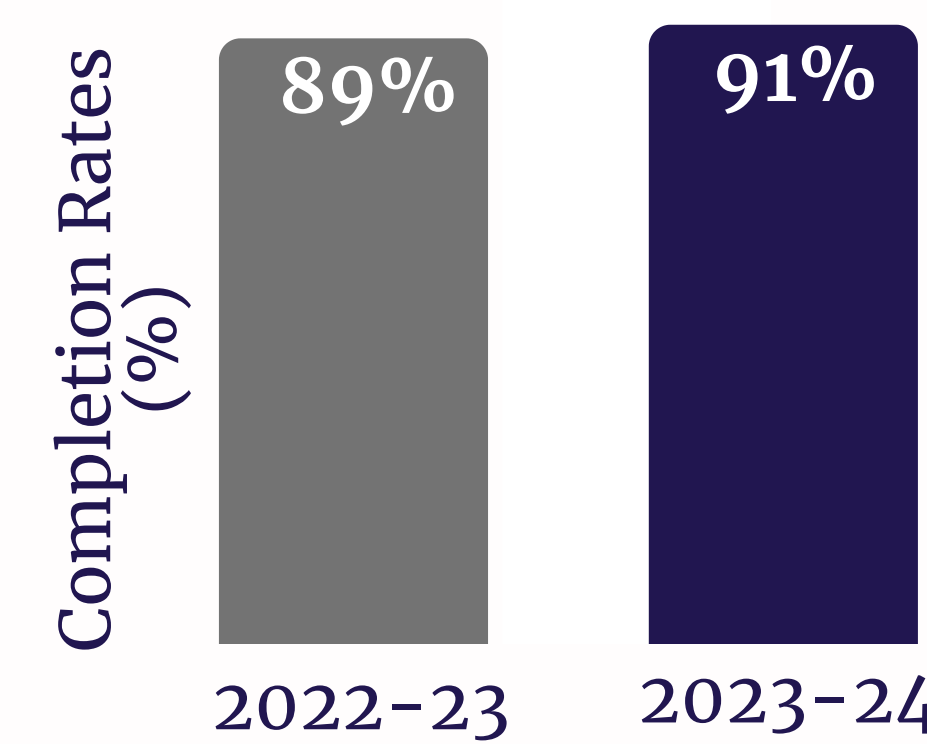


## INTERNSHIP SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

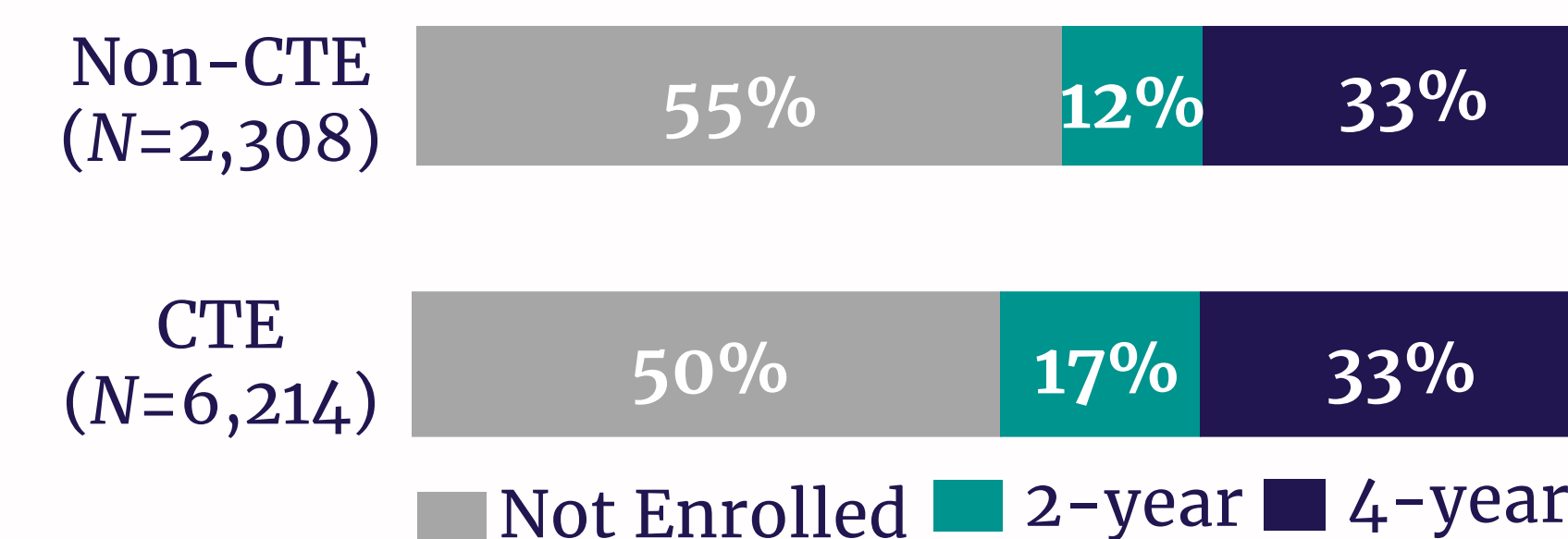


## OUTCOMES

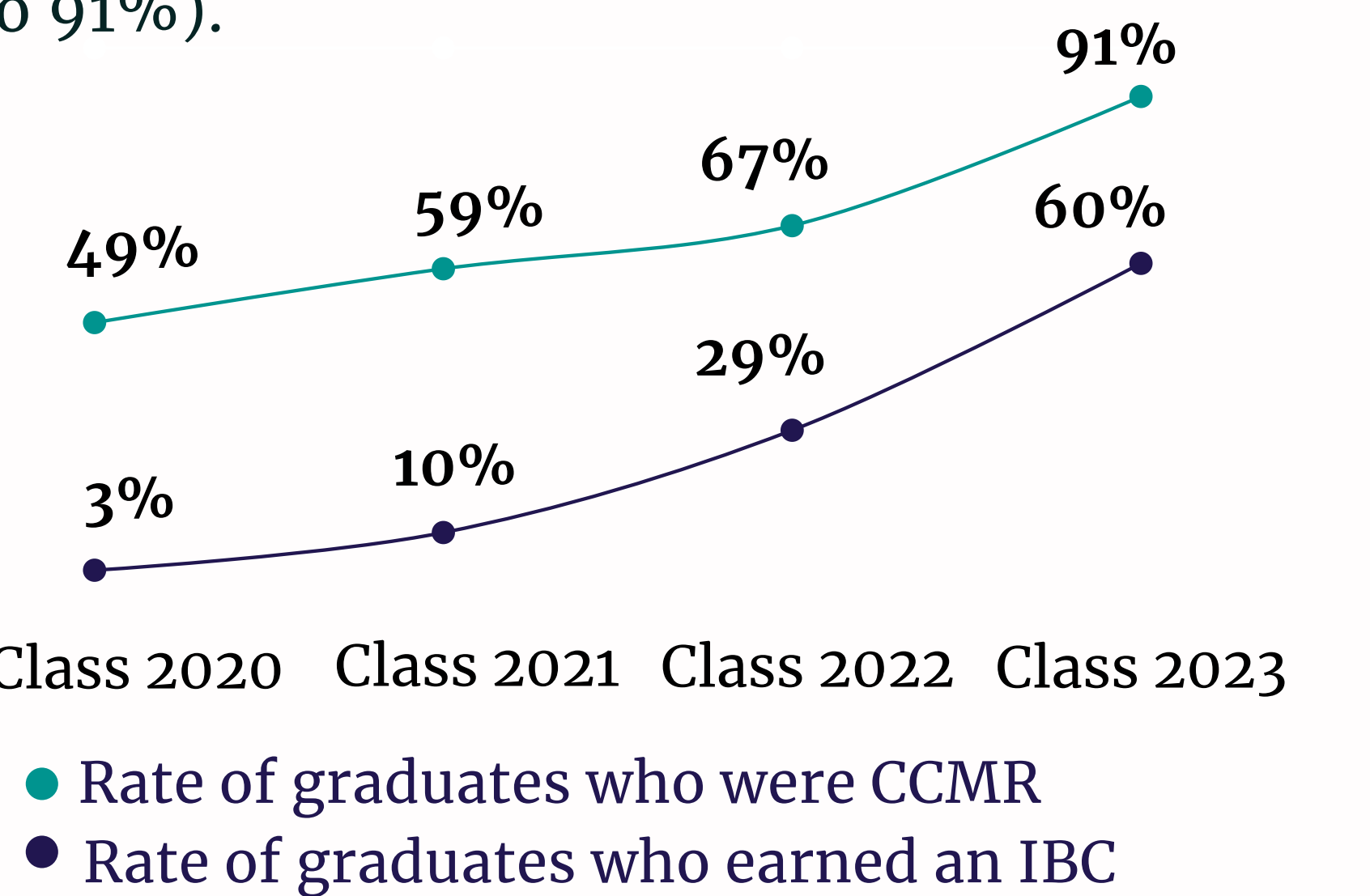
CTE course completion rates increased slightly from 89% (2022-23) to 91% (2023-24).



Overall, more 2022-23 CTE students (50%) enrolled in college within one year of graduation than non-CTE students (45%).



From the Class of 2020 to the Class of 2023, the TAPR report showed a 57 percentage-point increase in Dallas ISD graduates earning an IBC (from 3% to 60%) and a 42 percentage-point increase in CCMR graduates (from 49% to 91%).



## CTE TEACHER SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

- 88% of teachers indicated that the CTE program was implemented effectively at their campus.
