Why Coding?

- » Computer programming jobs are growing at 2x the national average.
- » Computing occupations are among the highest-paying jobs for new graduates.
- » By 2018, 51 percent of all STEM jobs are projected to be in CS-related fields.



More reasons

- » 9 of 10 parents wish computer science was taught in their kids' schools
- » 2.4% of college students graduate with a degree in computer science.
 - » Only 12% of CS degrees are earned by women.
- » NEW! President's Computer Science for All plan
 - » 3 years, \$4B to support CS education in K-12



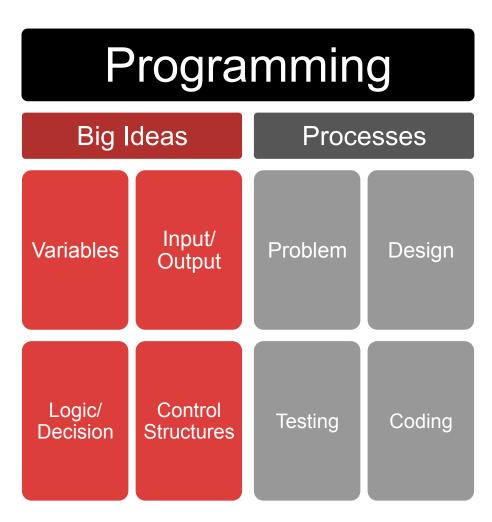
Coding in TX

- » Computing jobs are growing at 3.7x the state average
- » Texas is the only state to require high schools to offer computer science to all students.
- » In Texas:
 - ✓ CS counts as math or science credit
 - ✓ CS counts as credit for HS graduation
 - ✓ Clear certification pathways for CS teachers
 - ✓ CS curriculum standards

 - » 1 Application Lesson

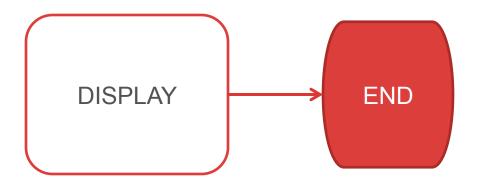


Unit 1, Skill Builder 2

- » Be sure to close your " "
- » Don't press CLEAR to delete
- » Select commands from program menu
- » Programs save as you type

- » Perform calculations within **Disp** statements



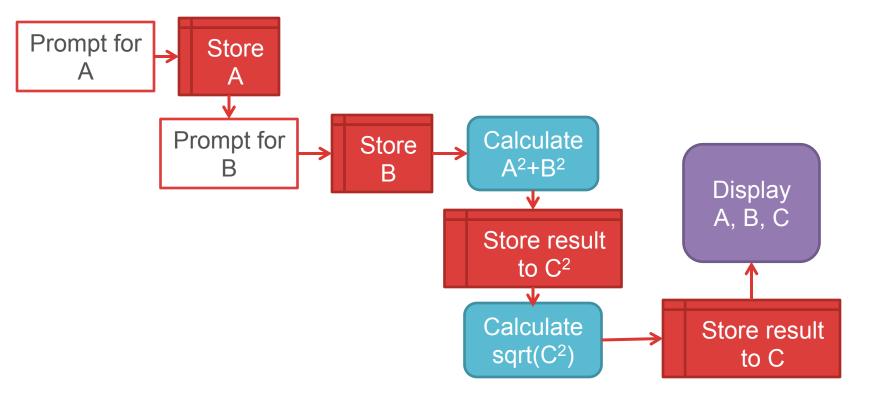
Unit 2, Skill Builder 3

- » Store the results of expressions in variables



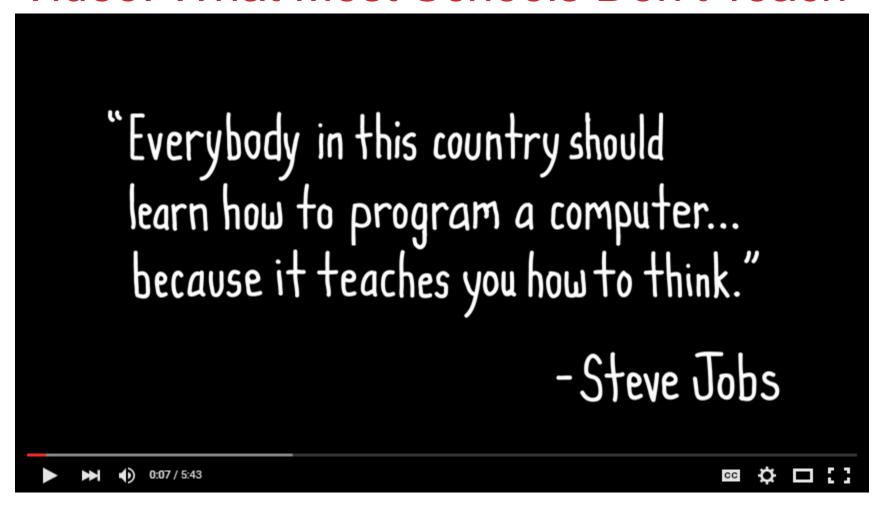
Unit 2 Application
