

### 2026 Orientation Leader Job Description

Orientation Leaders (O-Team) play a key role in shaping the new student experience during our orientation programs (Stampede, MustangStartUp, RoundUp). The O-team helps execute Stampede Welcome Week by designing and leading hallmark programs that set the tone for campus life. Orientation Leaders also mentor and train Stampede Guides, helping to build meaningful connections between new students and the SMU community. In addition, Orientation Leaders actively participate in RoundUp, the extended orientation program designed to further support a smooth and engaging transition for incoming students.



### **Essential Qualifications**

- Non-Graduating Undergraduate Student
- Must have and maintain a minimum 2.75 GPA by Spring 2026 semester (Those with a GPA lower than 2.5 will be given a chance to explain this if given an individual interview).
- Eligible to work in the United States and passing of a background check.
- Enrolled at SMU for the Spring 2026 and Fall 2026 semesters
- Must be in good academic and conduct standing with SMU throughout employment
- Cannot be an RA
- Cannot enroll in (in-person) summer classes for the summer term (only Maymester is allowed)
- Must not have another SMU job at the time of employment (Summer 2026)

# <u>Job Responsibilities</u>

Orientation leader responsibilities will range from leading new students during orientation programs and small group Zoom sessions. OLs must exhibit qualities and skills of communication, empathy, teamwork, critical thinking, problem-solving, adaptability, a positive can-do attitude, and teachability. The responsibilities of an OL include, but are not limited to:

- Welcome new students, parents, and families to SMU
- Conduct three small group Zoom sessions for incoming students on topics that prepare incoming students for life on the Hilltop
- Perform in front of a large audience during the Opening Session of Stampede.
- Assist with the Stampede and RoundUp check-in process
- Move and lift orientation program supplies and prepare them for Stampede and RoundUp
- Serve on one of three event planning committees alongside fellow OLs. Those committees can be found below:
  - RBW (Red, Blue, and White Events) small group programs and fun activities for incoming students to get to know one another during Stampede Welcome Week. This group is responsible for equipping Stampede Guides to execute these events.
  - Dynamic Duo Events our signature Stampede events, which include the Opening Session and Stampede Sundown
  - RoundUp Directors plan, implement, and lead the RoundUp program for incoming first-year students. These directors are responsible for the various logistical and programmatic aspects of RoundUp.
- Assist with other Stampede events such as Kickoff and Class Photo
- Daily summer office hours (9 AM-4 PM)
- Attending 1:1s with professional staff
- Speaking on behalf of Orientation at Stampede Guide Informational sessions
- Recruiting, Selecting, Interviewing, and Training Stampede Guides
- Marketing and Public Relations (Social Media Takeovers, Flyer designs)

• Work strenuous, irregular hours during major orientation programming (but have tons of fun!)

# **Time Commitments**



- <u>Spring Training</u>: All Orientation Leaders will be expected to attend the weekly 2-hour Orientation Leader meetings throughout the Spring semester. The class will cover general leadership topics ranging from mentorship and team development to conflict management and belonging. The Spring class is required for all staff. We will work with you if you have a major-specific class scheduled during the class.
- <u>OL Retreat</u>: Orientation Leaders will be expected to participate in the OL Retreat at the beginning of Summer training
- <u>Summer Training</u>: Intensive training will occur before RoundUp and summer prep for Stampede. Leaders will be trained on a variety of subjects, including campus policies and resources, academic advising, facilitating small groups, presentation skills, professional development, and much more. Summer training is required for all staff.
- <u>Team Development Days</u>: Orientation Leaders will be expected to be present at Team Development Dates will be communicated ahead of time.
- <u>Summer Orientation Program</u>s: Orientation Leaders must be present at all orientation programs. A complete schedule of required assignments will be provided before the start of the summer.
- Additional Orientation Programming: Orientation Leaders may be instructed to work additional Orientation and Transition Programs-sponsored events, including, but not limited to: RoundUp, Summer Send Offs, A Night at the Club, among others. Dates will be communicated ahead of time.
