# Planning Fall Finals

Now is the time to talk to your professor about finals. We encourage you to take your final with your professor, but if that is not feasible, you may be able to take your a final at DASS.

11/1—11/28 is the 4 week window to schedule your final at DASS, using the Online Scheduler. This will be your only opportunity to schedule.

# Here are a few reminders for scheduling finals at DASS:

- Your final should be scheduled closest to the time of your class final. Check the registrar's schedule here:https://www.smu.edu/Enrollm entServices/Registrar/Enrollment/FinalExamSchedule/Fall2017
- Otherwise, DASS must get an email from your professor approving you to test at a different time from your class if you have a conflict. Please forward the entire email chain to DASS, giving permission.
- There are limited seats available for each testing time. The earlier you schedule your final the better chance you have getting the time slot you need.
- Don't wait until 11/28. We will likely be full by then!

### **Handling Your Accommodations**

### DO'S

- DO make an appointment with your professor to discuss your accommodations.
- DO set up your test with your professor or schedule your test at least 7 days out from the test date with the online scheduler: https://dassscheduler.smu.edu/
- DO discuss your accommodations with your professor at least a week before you test.
- Do share any time conflict you have with your professor regarding using your extended time.

### DON'TS

- Don't hand your letter to your professor before or after class. You miss having the necessary discussion to make plans for your accommodations.
- Don't schedule 6 days or less online—The online scheduler will not allow you! That's not enough time for us to make arrangements.
- Don't walk in the day of your test and tell your professor you have testing accommodations.
- Don't assume your professor will be fine with you scheduling a test at DASS well outside the class time. The instructor must approve this!
