SPRING FINALS @ DASS



Final exams may not be booked before or after these dates.



- Before an exam is scheduled at DASS, the student must meet and discuss the testing arrangement with their professor.
- ◆ There is limited seating in a testing room. Only 15 students are allowed in the testing room. Due to these limitations it is important for students to arrange for their exam at DASS as early as possible.
- Students' exams should be scheduled as close to the time of their class final. If a student schedules a final that is not the same day and time as the class, we will need the professor to approve the time/date change. Get started on Final Projects and Papers
