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# GENERAL INFORMATION

## How To Get to SMU

Southern Methodist University is located in the city of University Park, between North Central Expressway (east) and Hillcrest (west), and Mockingbird Lane (south) and Daniel Avenue (north). Please check the SMU website for a current map, [www.smu.edu/maps](http://www.smu.edu/maps).

### ***From US 75 (Central Expressway)***

Traveling from the north, take the Lovers Lane/University Boulevard/SMU Boulevard exit. Continue on the service road to SUniversity. Turn right (west) onto campus. Simmons Hall is at the southwest corner of university and Airline Road.

Traveling from the south, take the Mockingbird Lane/SMU Boulevard exit. Continue on the service road to SMU Boulevard. Turn left (west). Moody Parking Center is at the southeast corner of SMU Boulevard and Airline Road.

### ***From the Dallas/Fort Worth Airport or Love Field***

If you are flying to Dallas unaccompanied, a representative of SMU/TAG will meet you at the baggage claim area when your plane arrives only if you complete the form at the end of this booklet and return it as required. If the TAG representative is delayed, DO NOT PANIC! STAY IN THE BAGGAGE CLAIM AREA! If you wait more than 30 minutes, call McElvaney Desk, 214.768.2247, and ask for a message to be delivered to the TAG Hall Staff at Peyton Hall. Remain seated in the baggage area! If you have a last minute travel emergency, call McElvaney Desk, 214.768.2230. No one will be in the TAG office on opening day to take your call. Do not call the TAG office!

\*Students traveling unaccompanied who wish to be met at the airport should plan their arrival between 10:00 AM and 11:30 AM on opening day. Please fill out the enclosed form (page 18) and return it to our office by June 29. We cannot schedule pickup if notification arrives after June 29.

If you arrive at D/FW airport with a parent or guardian, you should plan to take a Super Shuttle (approximately \$40) or taxi (approximately \$50) directly to the residence hall. Shuttles are available at the airport outside all baggage claim areas. The best mode of transportation from Love Field to SMU is a taxi. The taxi fare is about \$0 plus gratuity. Leave your luggage at Peyton Hall then come to registration (see below).

Traveling from the north, take the Lovers Lane/University Boulevard/SMU Boulevard exit. Continue on the service road to SMU Boulevard. Turn right (west) onto campus. Moody Parking Center is at the southeast corner of SMU Boulevard and Airline Road.

Traveling from the south, take the Mockingbird Lane/SMU Boulevard exit. Continue on the service road to SMU Boulevard. Turn left (west). Moody Parking Center is at the southeast corner of SMU Boulevard and Airline Road.

## Check-in Sunday, July 5, 2015

1. Report to the lobby of Simmons Hall between 1:00 pm and 2:00 p.m. on opening day, July 5, to receive student packets and officially check-in. Limited parking is available on campus, [www.smu.edu/maps](http://www.smu.edu/maps). #42 on attached map. Park in lot "U" at the corner of University and Airline Road.
2. After you have checked-in you will be directed to the dorm registration, meet your RA (Resident Assistant) and move into your room. Peyton Hall - # 16 on attached map. Park on Bishop Blvd. (left side of the street).
3. The opening ceremony and faculty meet and greet will be in the McCord Auditorium – Dallas Hall at 3:00 PM. Dress for the opening ceremony is casual school attire. All students must wear the complimentary official TAG T-shirt and name tag, which you will receive at registration. Park in "E" lot behind Dallas Hall
4. Place parking permit that is attached to this email on the dashboard of your car for the duration of the day. Please read permit for authorizations and restrictions.

If you are unable to arrive on campus before 2:00 PM., please contact the TAG office 214.768.0123 no later than Monday, June 29, to schedule an appointment for your check-in.

\*NOTE: This must be done in advance to assure your pick-up and return. There are many traveling students to coordinate.

## Residence Hall

Peyton Hall is an air-conditioned dormitory. During the time of the program, it will house TAG students and their counselors. Students may check into their dorm rooms on opening day between 12:15 PM and 1:30 PM. No one may check into the residence hall before registering! (See page 3 for Check-in location) Parents and students, please look around your room and note any broken or missing items. Report any problems in writing to any RA. Please notify your RA immediately if you have air conditioning problems. \*Students traveling unaccompanied who wish to be met at the airport should plan their arrival between 10:00 AM and 11:30 AM on opening day. Please fill out the enclosed form (page 18) and return it to our office by June 29. We will not schedule pickup if notification arrives after June 29.

At check-in, students will be issued a Swipe Card (meal card) and room key. Please take special care of these items while you are on campus. **You will be charged a fee of \$10.00 if you lose a card and \$75.00 for a lost key.** If you lose your card or key, or if it doesn't function correctly, please notify the Hall Director or your RA immediately! We can correct problems only when we know about them!

## Meals

All students will dine with the resident assistants (RA's) and other TAG staff in RFOC dining hall located in Umphrey Lee for all meals. (Some meals will be eaten in TAG "clan" groups.) Portions are generous and refills unlimited. Many vegetarian meals are available; hot entrees, fruits and salads are offered at each meal along with sandwiches and cereal. The fare is typically institutional. It is not gourmet, but there is plenty of it! If students have special dietary needs or complaints about quality, quantity, or service, please notify TAG staff immediately.

## Religious Services

Protestant, Catholic, and Jewish religious services are held weekly at Perkins Chapel on the SMU campus. The Highland Park Methodist Church is adjacent to the campus. If you have a special interest in attending a particular place of worship, please make your request by July 1. Each child who wishes to attend religious services is responsible for being ready at the posted time for departure from the dorm.

## Closing Activities, Friday, July 24, 2015

Closing Activities, Friday, July 24, 2015

1. SMU/TAG classes will end on Friday, July 24, at 11:30 am.

Students will eat their lunch in the cafeteria as usual following the last class.

2. Parents are invited to a reception in the Simmons Hall (#42 on attached map) from 11:30 AM - 1 PM. #42 on attached map. Park in lot "U" at the corner of University and Airline Road.

3. The closing ceremonies are scheduled for 2:00 PM in McCord Auditorium – Dallas Hall. Park in Daniel Parking Center #2 ("N" on the attached map.)

4. Place parking permit you received by email on the dashboard of your car for the duration of the day. Please read permit for authorizations and restrictions.

Dress for TAG closing ceremony should be neat but not elaborate. Boys should wear casual slacks or nice jeans or shorts and shirt. Girls should wear a conservative sports outfit such as cropped pants or a summer dress. Most students dress informally.

## Departure from Dallas

All students must vacate their rooms by 1:45 PM on closing day. The dorm will be closed and locked after this time. Students departing from Dallas in the company of a parent or guardian may leave the campus when they wish after the farewell ceremony. TAG students departing unaccompanied, by plane, should schedule their departures between 6:00 PM and 8:00 PM. Resident counselors or other representatives of SMU/TAG will take students to the airport if prior arrangements are made. Please fill out the enclosed form (page 18) and return it to our office by June 29. Please plan departure times between 6:00 and 8:00 PM. Students traveling without parents or guardians will be taken directly to the ticket counter, where they will be left to make their way to the restricted gate area alone. These students will store luggage temporarily at Peyton Hall. If flights are at other times, we will assist students in making other transportation arrangements to the airport at the students' expense.

## Medical Care

Each individual is responsible for his/her own fees accrued at the Health Center, 214.768.2141 ([www.smu.edu/healthcenter/](http://www.smu.edu/healthcenter/)).

SMU/TAG provides basic accident insurance for injury while students are on campus or while they are involved in program-related activities. Under this coverage, students will generally be treated without charge (for accidents, not illness) at the Student Health Center. Should your child require medical services other than for an accident, these charges will be billed to you at your home address. This includes medication needs. On weekends, the Student Health Center is not open and the students must go "off campus." If you prefer a particular weekend health service, please let us know in writing.

## Important Medical Information

No student will be allowed to move into the dorm until all medical forms are complete. These forms must be filled out thoroughly and legibly in blue ink, and have original signatures. Medical personnel will refer to this form whenever medical treatment is necessary; this form is the only guide a health care provider will have in case of emergency. It is imperative that all parts of the form be completed. Information provided on these forms will be treated with the greatest possible confidentiality. At the end of the TAG program, medical forms will be destroyed.

## Please Note Procedures for Administering Medications

Students who require prescription medications and/or injections while attending TAG must bring the medication/serum to SMU clearly labeled with the student's name, contents, and dosage information. All medication must be left with the Hall Director upon the student's arrival at the dorm on opening day. An original copy of the doctor's orders and an explanation of the purpose of the medication, on letterhead stationery, must be attached to the container. A copy of this letter must be provided to the TAG office to be attached to the Medical History Form. It will be the responsibility of the student to take his/her medication. The hall director can only be responsible for monitoring the dispensing of the medicine. Legal restrictions prevent staff from reminding students to take medications. Please discuss with TAG students the importance of reporting to the Hall Director to get medication.

Any student who will require injections during the program must contact the TAG office at least two weeks prior to the opening of the program. These injections will be administered by a licensed health practitioner at the student health center. There is a small additional fee for this service.

## What Should I Bring To TAG?

This is a frequent question in the TAG office. The following list contains our suggestions.

- Neat sports outfits for closing ceremony and dance
- Shorts, jeans and t-shirts for class (dress is casual)
- Robe and slippers
- Swim suit,
- Clothes hangers
- Comfortable walking shoes
- Water Bottle
- Towels and washcloths
- Hair dryer
- Soap, toothpaste, shampoo, etc.
- Alarm clock
- Laundry bag/basket, laundry detergent,
- Study lamp (not Halogen)
- Pillow and blanket. **The dorm may get cold, so bring a warm comforter or blanket.**
- Backpack or book bag
- School supplies such as paper, pencils, pens, dictionary, thesaurus, spiral notebooks, etc.
- Board games
- Musical instrument such as guitar (if you play an instrument),
- \$75-\$100 in spending money (Traveler's checks cannot be cashed without picture ID. Consider a debit card or cash.)

Note: For those students who wish to participate in the talent show and/or coffee house, please bring the items needed for a performance.

Each room has a telephone permanently installed and connected but **do not** have voice mail service. Students may use the phones until "lights out" each night. Telephone privileges are withheld if this rule is violated. Long distance calls must be made using a credit card or the "collect" option. Incoming calls, even from home, must be completed prior to 10:00 P.M. unless special arrangements are made with the hall director. TAG students are busy all day! Parents, please arrange times for calls with your child to avoid disappointment! No incoming or outgoing calls are allowed during study time. If you must reach your child at this time or in an emergency, call the TAG Hall Director. We do not encourage cell phones, and they should never be taken to class. We reserve the right to confiscate cell phones if used irresponsibly.

Some students bring personal computers for use with their class work. There are a few computers in the residence hall. A lab may be available for TAG students in the evening. SMU assumes no responsibility for any personal items including computers, cameras, phones, or other items. Students bring these at their own risk. If you bring your own computer, etc., you should be especially careful to lock your room.

Note: The residence hall will provide a change of bed linens (sheets & pillowcase) weekly. Students will change their own bed linens. Towels are not furnished.

*Halogen lamps, candles, and incense are **not** allowed in the dorms on the SMU campus and will be confiscated.*

Tobacco, alcoholic drinks and illegal substances are, of course, strictly prohibited. Students possessing these substances are subject to immediate dismissal from the TAG program.

***For All TAG Students: You are enrolled in a college-credit class!***

All credit courses will be taught at the same level as the freshman SMU courses. As a student taking a credit course during the TAG program, you must understand that you will be doing college-level work. The final grade for your morning class will be recorded on your SMU transcript. An "A" or "B" is an acceptable grade. The last date to drop a credit class and receive a WP (withdraw passing) is **Tuesday, July 21st**. After that date, course grade(s) will become a permanent part of the student's SMU transcript. Registration means that a permanent SMU transcript will be created for each TAG student, and the transcript will record the grade earned for the morning-college-credit course in which each TAG student is registered.

***Homework***

You will have a significant amount of reading and preparation for your morning class to do each day outside of class. While time is set aside for study, each student is responsible for making time in his/her daily schedule for preparation. For all students, this may mean an occasional choice of study instead of recreation. Students, please arrange for extra needed study with your RA or Hall Director. During evening activities, there is always a study hall option. This is the student's responsibility! Afternoon classes do not require homework. All activities are completed in class. If you are having trouble completing your work in class, please talk to your instructor first. Still having trouble? Meet with the Hall Director. Do not delay consulting an adult if you are having any class problems.

***Study Halls***

In addition to the two three-hour class times each day, you will be required to attend additional hours of supervised study hall outside of regular class hours. This time is provided for your benefit. Remember—no phone calls during study hall.

***Papers***

You may be required to do research and write a paper or make a presentation in your classes.

***Tests***

You will be tested as a part of earning the college-credit grade. Afternoon non-credit classes may also have tests.

***Transcript***

The grade you earn in a credit class will be on your permanent college record. It is a fully transferable SMU 3-hour class credit. To obtain a copy of your SMU transcript, contact the SMU Registrar's Office at [www.smu.edu/registrar](http://www.smu.edu/registrar).

***Grades***

Students will receive grades in both classes. Parents will receive written evaluations from instructors by mail approximately two weeks after the program ends.

We want you to succeed in this very ambitious undertaking, and we wish you the best learning experience possible. If you ever need help, contact your professor, the hall director, or the TAG office. We are all available to help you succeed! Please do not put off asking for help when it is needed!



# SMU STUDENT HANDBOOK; STUDENT LIFE AND HONOR CODE

Use this link to get familiar with YOUR responsibilities for creating and maintaining an atmosphere of honesty and integrity.

The SMU Student Handbook is your guide to information and services on campus. It includes information related to your rights and responsibilities as members of the SMU community. The handbook includes the Student Code of Conduct, the Judicial Code, Honor Code, and information/expectations that the University feels it is necessary to communicate to our students. By becoming a member of the SMU community, you are agreeing to abide by and be held accountable to the policies and procedure outlined in the SMU Student Handbook. Thus, I hope that you will familiarize yourself with this information and let us know if you have questions.

## The Honor Code

Intellectual integrity and academic honesty are fundamental to the processes of learning and of evaluating academic performance, and maintaining them is the responsibility of all members of an educational institution. The inculcation of personal standards of honesty and integrity is a goal of education in all the disciplines of the University.

The faculty has the responsibility of encouraging and maintaining an atmosphere of academic honesty by being certain that students are aware of the value of it, that they understand the regulations defining it, and that they know the penalties for departing from it. The faculty should, as far as is reasonably possible, assist students in avoiding the temptation to cheat. Faculty members must be aware that permitting dishonesty is not open to personal choice. A professor or instructor who is unwilling to act upon offenses is an accessory with the student offender in deteriorating the integrity of the University.

Students must share the responsibility for creating and maintaining an atmosphere of honesty and integrity. Students should be aware that personal experience in completing assigned work is essential to learning. Permitting others to prepare their work, using published or unpublished summaries as a substitute for studying required materials, or giving or receiving unauthorized assistance in the preparation of work to be submitted are directly contrary to the honest process of learning. Students who are aware that others in a course are cheating or otherwise acting dishonestly have the responsibility to inform the professor and/or bring an accusation to the Honor Council.

Students and faculty members must mutually share the knowledge that any dishonest practices permitted will make it more difficult for the honest students to be evaluated and graded fairly and will damage the integrity of the whole University. Students should recognize that both their own interest, and their integrity as individuals, suffer if they condone dishonesty in others.

# THE CONSTITUTION OF THE HONOR COUNCIL OF SOUTHERN METHODIST UNIVERSITY

**PREAMBLE AND DEFINITIONS** We, the students of Southern Methodist University, with the approval of the Provost and the Dean of Student Life, establish the Honor Council to uphold the standards of academic integrity set forth in the Honor Code. Acts punishable under the code include, but are not limited to the following:

**ACADEMIC SABOTAGE** Intentionally taking any action which negatively affects the academic work of another student.

**CHEATING** Intentionally<sup>1</sup> using or attempting to use unauthorized materials, information, or study aids in any academic exercise<sup>2</sup>.

**FABRICATION** Intentional and unauthorized falsification or invention of any information or citation in an academic exercise<sup>3</sup>.

**FACILITATING ACADEMIC DISHONESTY** Intentionally or knowingly helping or attempting to help another to violate any provision of the Honor Code<sup>4</sup>.

**PLAGIARISM**<sup>5</sup> Intentionally or knowingly representing the words or ideas of another as one's own in any academic exercise.

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<sup>1</sup> Labeling a student as being "dishonest" constitutes a form of moral condemnation, which can be a legitimate sanction in itself. Such moral condemnation, however, is not normally imposed for a simple act of negligence (e.g., a typographical error resulting in a miscited source). A student who cites long passages from a book without acknowledgment cannot expect to convince the decision maker that the omission was merely "negligent." Such ignorance is not a valid defense. Not knowing what one has done (e.g., inadvertently omitting a footnote) is to be distinguished from knowingly doing something while ignorant of a rule.

<sup>2</sup> The term "academic exercise" includes all forms of work submitted for credit or honors at the University, as well as materials submitted to other institutions or organizations for evaluation or publication.

<sup>3</sup> For example, a writer should not reproduce a quotation found in a book review and indicate that quotation was obtained from the book itself. Likewise, it would be improper to analyze one sample in a laboratory experiment and covertly "invent" data based on that single experiment for three more required analyses.

<sup>4</sup> For example, one who provided term papers or examinations to other students while knowing or having reason to know that such materials would be used in violation of the Honor Code would be responsible for "facilitating academic dishonesty."

<sup>5</sup> In regards to cases of plagiarism, ignorance of the rules is not an excuse. The University subscribes to the statement on plagiarism which appears on page six of William Watt's *An American Rhetoric* (1955).

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**IMPEDING HONOR COUNCIL INVESTIGATION** Impeding the investigation of the council, lying to the council, or in any way failing to cooperate with the council.

The general principles for all honest writing can be summarized briefly. Acknowledge indebtedness:

1. Whenever you quote another person's actual words.

2. Whenever you use another person's idea, opinion, or theory, even if it is completely paraphrased in your own words.

3. Whenever you borrow facts, statistics, or other illustrative material - unless the information is common knowledge.

Plagiarism also encompasses the notions of citing quotations and materials from secondary sources that were not directly consulted in the preparation of the student's work, and copying the organizational and argumentation structure of a work without acknowledging its author.

# TYPICAL TAG DAILY SCHEDULE

8:00–9:00 AM	<b>CHECK OUT &amp; BREAKFAST</b> All students should leave the residence hall by 8:50 AM. All students are expected to go to the cafeteria for breakfast (full or continental).
9:00–12:00 noon	<b>MORNING CLASS</b> Classes are for college credit . All morning classes require homework. Note: Students should not arrive in classrooms or be in academic buildings before 8:55 AM unless special arrangements have been made with your professor!
12:00–12:45 PM	<b>LUNCH IN FFoc Arnold Dining Hall</b> Note: Students are asked to remain in dining hall during lunch unless they have a significant need to return to the residence hall.
12:45–3:30 PM	<b>AFTERNOON CLASS</b> Afternoon classes are all noncredit. All are “hands-on” with no homework required. Note: Students should arrive no earlier than 12:55 and follow rules as explained with morning class.
4:00–5:00 PM	<b>FREE TIME</b> Signs will be posted with activity options. Study is always an option at this time.
5:00–6:00 PM	<b>DINNER IN FFoc Arnold Dining Hall</b> Students will dine informally or with their RA groups for dinner.
6:15–7:45 PM	<b>STUDY HALL</b> RAs serve as tutors when needed; a special tutor is provided as needed. It is the student’s responsibility to request tutoring . Remember–ask your instructor first! There are to be no incoming or outgoing calls.
8:00–9:15 PM	<b>EVENING ACTIVITY</b>
9:30–10:00 PM	<b>GROUP TIME</b> Students are divided into RA groups for informal discussion and occasional excursions for ice cream or pizza.
10:00–10:45 PM	<b>PERSONAL TIME</b> (Shower, get ready for bed, study, etc.) No phone calls after 10:00 PM except in emergencies.
11:00 PM	<b>LIGHTS OUT!!!! BED CHECK</b> Unless students have special permission, they must remain quietly in their own rooms. The staff members monitor halls and lounges, etc. from “Lights Out” until “Morning Checkout.”

# PARENT INFORMATION

## Student Phones

Your sons and daughters will be very busy throughout the TAG Program. If there are any problems, you will be notified. If you don't hear from your child, assume he/she is okay and just very involved. When you arrive, you will learn your student's telephone number. Complete directions for programming the phones are in each room. Please check the phone function before you leave campus. You can call in at any time from 7 AM to 10 PM (except for study hall time). If you are eager to speak to your child, arrange a time for him/her to receive your call. Students can call out from the time they get up until "lights-out" time (except for class time and study hall time). If you have trouble reaching your child by phone, please call the TAG office. We will investigate and ask your child to call home. If you need to visit the TAG office, come to 3101 University Blvd, Suite 163C (see map). We do not encourage cell phones, and they should never be taken to class. We reserve the right to confiscate cell phones if used irresponsibly.

## Leaving Campus

The TAG program, like other summer camps, is planned as an inclusive three-week program. It is a three-week residential program. We ask that students remain on campus for all three weeks. We plan it to work like any other "sleep-away" camp. Every day is full of study and other activities. Therefore, we ask that after you leave on Opening Day (July 5th), you not return until Closing Day (July 24th). Any possible exception will be handled individually by either the Pre-College Program Director, or in her absence by the Associate Dean or the Residence Hall Director.

## Deliveries

All deliveries must be made to the TAG office at 3101 University Blvd, Suite 163C between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., Monday thru Friday. The hall staff **will not** accept any delivery made to the residence hall.
